

Application Procedure

A portfolio (file, folder, etc.) is a convenient and professional manner in which to present your application materials. Portfolios should include:

1. Two letters of recommendation. (One must be from the applicant's current principal or department chair.)
2. A personal statement (400-500 words) identifying the applicant's preference of program and explaining his or her commitment to it. Goals, impact on teaching, implications for students' learning and application to the overall Educational program should also be addressed.
3. Current résumé including name, address, phone, e-mail, Fax number, institutional affiliation, teaching experience, academic qualifications, list of degrees, g.p.a., and professional involvement.
4. Completed application folders must be received no later than **March 4, 2012**

5. Applications will be reviewed by the E-SU Education Committee who may invite finalist candidates to an informal interview.
6. The scholar will submit an end-of-course report and be invited to present highlights of the experience at the annual fundraising event.

The ESU Cuthbert-Douglas Scholarship-Douglas Program provides an opportunity for an Arizona teacher to study in England. It is hoped that such a program of study will enable the recipient to enhance his or her professional background and effectiveness in the classroom. Ultimately, it is hoped that as a teacher's life is enriched, so are those of his or her students. This year's program is assisted by a Treadwell Memorial Travel Grant.

ELIGIBILITY

The applicant must...

1. Be a certificated teacher in English/Theatre (including composition, language, literature, drama or speech) for grades 9 through 12.
2. Teach in a public, private, parochial or charter school in the northern Arizona area which lies north of the southern boundary of Maricopa County.
3. Have a minimum of 6 years teaching experience, 3 of which must be within the designated geographic area.
4. Agree to return to secondary level teaching in the year following the scholarship.
5. Be available for travel at times specified for the program of choice.
6. Be willing to serve, now and in the future, as an "Ambassador of Education" for ESU, its aims and responsibilities.
7. Accept responsibility for any costs and expenses not covered by the scholarship and for fees in the event of cancellation.



Camp Shakespeare For Seniors

PLACE AND DATES

Camp Shakespeare for Seniors 2012 will take place July 22-27 on the campus of Southern Utah University in Cedar City, Utah.

ACTIVITIES INCLUDED

The \$1,570 price of Camp Shakespeare for Seniors will include the following: center section, main-floor tickets to all six festival plays; five nights of double-occupancy housing at the Crystal Inn (July 22 through July 27); lunch and dinner (all you can eat), beginning Monday morning and ending Friday noon, in the lovely Hunter Conference Center (breakfast is served at the hotel); three semester units of college credit through SUU; free shuttle bus service between the motel and the festival complex; and five twelve-hour days of exciting activities, including interviews with all the principal actors, class sessions with Shakespearean scholars and members of the 2012 festival professional company, a special backstage tour, greenshows, drinks and desserts with the actors after one of the performances, a banquet in the Great Hall, and lots of unscheduled surprises. Students will also have access to many SUU recreational activities, such as swimming, tennis, volleyball, hiking, and all the sunshine and fresh mountain air they want! The principal item not included in the price of Camp Shakespeare is transportation to and from Cedar City.
