On November 9, members attending the Teachers Learning Abroad dinner at the University Club were treated to presentations by the two teachers awarded scholarships in 2017 – Jeannine Mortell and Lauren Wasser. Jeannine took us on a walking tour of Bath in celebration of Jane Austen, and Lauren put the audience through some of the exercises she learned at the Globe and had implemented in her classroom. The audience glowed with envy and enthusiasm for these teachers making a difference in their students’ understanding and use of English. In the second week of December, the ESU held its annual Holiday Tea with student finalists reading the essays that they wrote about the language of protest movements. It was a pleasure to hear them animate their words in their own voices – this event demonstrates every year the capacity of today’s students to voice their concerns about the world in ways literate beyond their years.

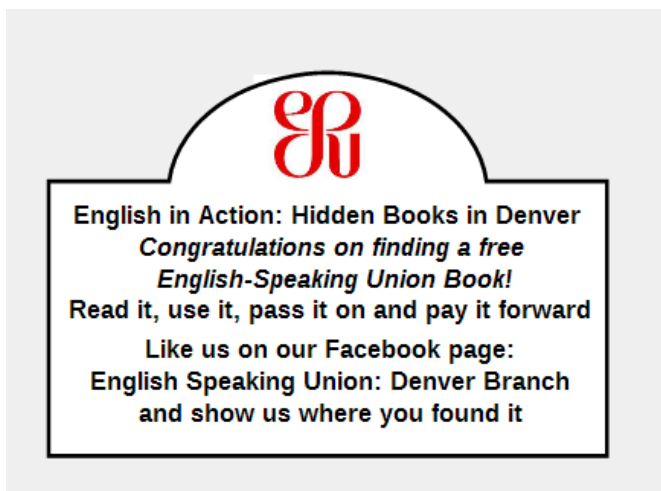

Before setting up this program for our branch, and I believe there are refugees waiting on tutors, I would like to hear from our members who might be interested in tutoring people who have some knowledge of English but want to improve their talking skills. I expect to go forward with this if we have at least 5-10 members who would like to be tutors.

We have a few new members, and I would like to thank them and all of you for supporting English in Action through the Denver branch of the English-Speaking Union. Denver’s students and teachers benefit from your support. We may soon be helping immigrants learn the advantages of English as well.

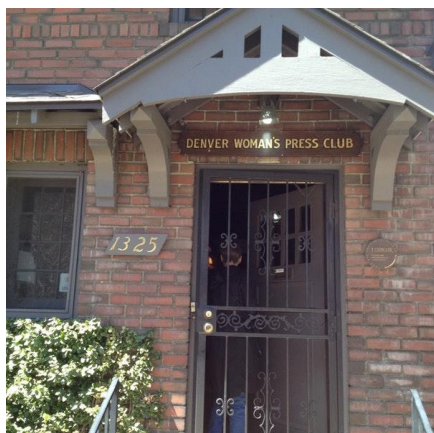

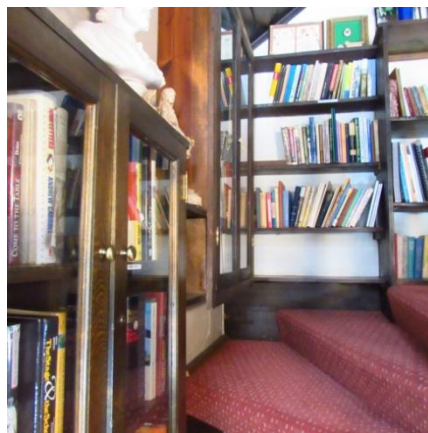

2018 ESU Denver Branch Shakespeare Competition

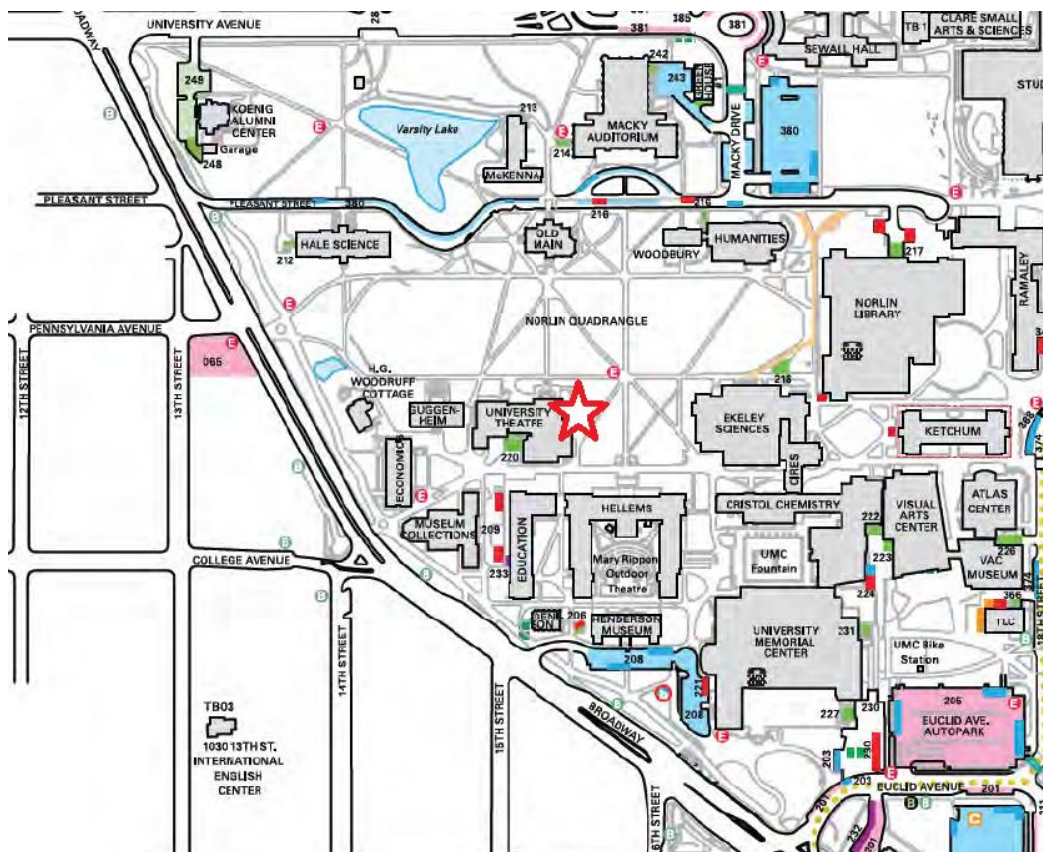
Sunday, February 11, 2018, 1 to 3 pm
