



The ESU 2025 Founder's Award Weekend on March 14-15, was a spectacular two-day celebration in Winter Park, FL, honoring ESU Chairman Dr. Quinn Peeper as the recipient of the organization's highest distinction in recognition of his outstanding contributions to the ESU's mission to advance Anglo-American relations, international friendship, and the promotion of English as a tool for global communication. The event brought together members, supporters, and distinguished guests from across the country and the international ESU community to recognize Dr. Peeper's exceptional leadership and dedication to the ESU's mission.

The weekend culminated in the grand Founder's Award Gala at the Winter Park Racquet Club, where Dr. Peeper and the ESU received greetings from the ESU Central Florida Branch, our gracious weekend hosts. Warm remarks also came from Bolormaa Jamiyansuren, speaking on behalf of the entire international ESU community, and Caroline Emma Stanley, Countess of Derby, who was also in attendance. The Countess spoke about the history, architecture and art collection of her family's ancestral home, Knowsley Hall, and extended a heartfelt invitation to a magical holiday weekend there from November 20–23, 2025.


