## Saturday, April 26

**3:00 to 4:00 pm** – Students participate in an acting workshop in the Garden Lounge, led by Broadway veteran Stephen Buntrock.

**3:00 to 4:00 pm** – Teachers attend a professional development workshop with Drama Educator and ESU Curriculum Consultant Sammi Smith.

**4:00 to 5:00 pm** – Students, parents/guardians, and "Family & Friends Package" holders enjoy afternoon tea and sandwiches in the Garden Lounge.

**5:00 pm** – Parents/guardians escort students to the Stephen Sondheim Theatre at 124 West 43rd Street (between 6th Avenue and Broadway) for the evening's performance.

**6:30 to 9:00 pm – & Juliet** at the Stephen Sondheim Theatre.

## Monday, April 28

**7:30 to 8:00 am** – Students and parents check in at the Stanley H. Kaplan Penthouse at Lincoln Center (10th Floor, Samuel B. and David Rose Building, 165 West 65th Street – between Broadway & Amsterdam). *Take the escalator or elevator from street level to the building lobby. Contestant and guest names will be at the reception table.* 

8:00 to 8:30 am - Audience is seated in the Kaplan Penthouse

**8:30 am to 1:00 pm** – *Semi-Final Round:* All 42 contestants will perform their monologues and sonnets. Performances will be divided into three 60-minute sessions, with 15-minute breaks between each.

**1:00 to 3:00 pm** – Parents and guests break for lunch on their own. Judges deliberate to select the Top 10 Finalists. Students will have lunch at the Juilliard cafeteria and proceed to the Lincoln Center Fountain for a group photo.

**3:00 pm** – Students return to the Kaplan Penthouse. The names of the Top 10 Finalists will be announced and posted outside the theater doors.

**3:00 to 4:00 pm** – Finalists rehearse for the Final Round.

3:30 to 4:00 pm - Audience is seated in the Kaplan Penthouse

**4:00 to 6:00 pm** – *Final Round:* The Top 10 Finalists perform. Judges deliberate for approximately 30 minutes. All students will be recognized and receive certificates from ESU leadership. Awards will be presented to the First, Second, and Third Place winners. Branch coordinators and teachers will also be acknowledged. The competition concludes, and attendees exit the theater.
