ESU Members are Helping Newcomers with Their English Skills Imagine every week, speaking with a new friend from another part of the world. You help your friend improve their English skills and, in turn, you learn something about who they are and where they are from. What develops is a strong bond that enriches your life while helping your friend improve theirs.

That is what ESU members from the Denver branch do every Monday evening in English in Action Across America. Together they speak with new immigrant students from New York City over Zoom and help them to improve their English language skills. For more than three years, they have continued to provide their students with the confidence they need to use English in their everyday lives.

English in Action Across America is an extension of the New York Citybased English in Action program that first started more than 50 years ago. This volunteer opportunity allows ESU members to participate individually as conversation tutors and also accommodates branches that wish to organize their own group, as Denver does.

Branches provide the volunteers, and ESU national provides the students. This program is easy to set up and can entice more members to get involved in their local branch.

Adding to this extraordinary occasion, the Countess of Derby, a distinguished art historian and cultural advocate, will join us to honor


her dear friend, Dr. Peeper.

Middle School Debate



The ESU Middle School Debate Program teaches students in grades 5-8 fundamentals of critical thinking and language arts skills through public speaking. The program is an adaptation of the parliamentary model of debate. Students engage in weekly debate activities and lively allday Saturday tournaments. The ESU

works closely with a dedicated team of coaches/teachers and volunteer judges to support 2,500 + students since 2011.

Secondary School Exchange (SSE) Scholarship

SSE is a merit-based scholarship that provides tuition, room and board for students to spend a "Gap" Year abroad in the UK or US between high

school and college. Since 1928, the SSE Scholarship has allowed thousands of students to expand their horizons by studying at secondary schools in the US and UK. SSE students gain maturity, independence, and global perspectives that benefit them in college and future careers.


Andrew Romay Immigrant Center (ARNIC)

The Andrew Romay New Immigrant Center (ARNIC) is a free program that facilitates the integration of immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees into U.S. life. We seek to provide immigrants with the tools and resources to overcome barriers and build successful lives in the U.S. Our

center offers English classes, conversation practice and career services. Each year we serve 350+ new immigrants. More than 2,000 immigrants from 60+ countries have benefited from our services since the center opened its doors.
