PVC and jelly rubber are the worst offenders—often containing phthalates, which the European Chemicals Agency has flagged as endocrine disruptors.

A consumer safety study from the Danish Environmental Protection Agency found that many sex toys contain chemicals that leach during use, with porous materials performing worst. The CDC's National Biomonitoring Program tracks human exposure to these exact chemical groups. This isn't hypothetical—it's measurable chemistry with documented health implications.

There is exactly one other body-safe material worth discussing: **borosilicate glass**. It's the same material as Pyrex lab equipment—non-porous, hypoallergenic, sterilizable, and temperature-responsive. A **glass dildo** can be warmed in hot water or chilled in the refrigerator for varied sensations. It's heavier than silicone, which some users prefer for the pressure and fullness that weight provides. It breaks if dropped, so inspect for chips before use. Otherwise, it's an excellent body-safe option with a completely different sensation profile than silicone.

304 and 316 surgical stainless steel rounds out the body-safe list—heavy, non-porous, indestructible, and sterilizable. Less common in realistic designs but worth knowing about.

The takeaway: if your **real dildo** isn't platinum-cured silicone or borosilicate glass, you're compromising on safety. Full stop.
